## Weather to play or not to play?

Activity around the club was severely impacted by weather since the last edition of the Dispatch and losing 6 days golf has been something of a shock to us all, considering how extremely fortunate we have been over the winter so far. If there is an 'upside' to the enforced break from golf for our Members, it is that the course itself - fairways in particular - has had an opportunity for well-deserved R & R and that can only be to our benefit in the long run.

The planned hollow-coring programme is now scheduled for just under 6 weeks time. Securing the required equipment for our preferred dates has been a challenge as, with very few suppliers, there is stiff competition among golf clubs for that equipment and timing is not always within our control. We know that this necessary maintenance process was a cause of some concern for Members last September and we Captains have worked closely with Course Committee and course staff to ensure that the process will be carried out to the highest standards on this and future occasions. We thank them for their assurances in this regard.

Captain Ann has been working hard to get the "short course" measured to ensure accessibility to golf for all our Members for longer by removing the need for arduous walks to some tee boxes. Lastly, we need to remind Members again that repair of fairway divots is a player's responsibility and protects our course. Ample divot bags are available - where sand runs low (a sign of use!), staff will fill the bins as soon as possible. Please do YOUR bit! The same can be said of pitchmarks on our greens - pitch in and repair a few, even if they are not your own.



## Save the date Ladies ....


Ladies club are holding a rules night on 15th March at 7.30pm.

The family lived in Enniskerry 6 girls Molly, Maura, Breda, Kay, Ann and Peggy and one boy Bill. If you thought the 16th hole was a handy par 3, maybe its time to think again as the bunker project on the hole is 90% complete. We are including an additional small bunker towards the middle to back right of the green and are working on the drainage on the hole also. This will hopefully lead to the hole being available as an option throughout the year when complete.



The foundations to place the new artificial strip on the 9th hole took place on Monday. We will place a crush mix along with reinforcing 804 on this surface with a wacker plate and have this framed with timber rails before the artificial strip is placed on the back of

the tee box.



On Monday we pencil tined the greens for general maintenance of the greens just for anyone who played this week. All of these works are being completed by our own Greenkeeping team.


## Introducing our new Treasurer, Colm Whooley

On taking up my second term as Hon Treasurer I have been asked to write a small piece on myself, which is never easy but here goes.

48 years ago, I joined the golf club at age of ten, following in my parents' footsteps. For some reason I was the one chosen from six boys to play golf. I quickly got involved with a very strong junior set up at the time and over the next 7 years enjoyed great success with two Smurfit Cup victories and a few years later was part of the winning Barton Cup team.

My golf probably reached its pinnacle at the age of 20 when I was picked for the Leinster Youths and Irish Universities teams.

After that my golf went in a decidedly negative direction, which probably reached its low point just last year when the Pierce Purcell Management team, of which I was part, took the very harsh decision to exclude me from the panel. Thankfully since that rebuke, I believe my golf has had a bit of a renaissance and I'm hopeful there are still a few productive golf years ahead. My wife Fiona (probably better known in the club than me because of her acting prowess with the Delgany Drama Group) tells me there better be, seeing as though I'm in the process of



getting fitted out for the new Stealth driver. That's all part of my plan to try and win the World over 60's, long drive competition!!

The last time I took on the Treasury Role was in Pat O'Mahony's year as Captain. Little did I know at that time that the world was about to come to an end and Ireland was heading into to a financial crisis, while the club was saddled with €4m in debt. Great work has been done in the interim by the club's officers to keep us on the straight and narrow to the point where the loan is down to a more manageable figure of about €1.6m. However, the loan repayments remain a huge burden and certainly have impacted on how much there is to spend across all areas of the club. Without any significant entrance fees, much lower green fees, reduced annual subscriptions and rising cost inflation, we don't have many options.

While managing our costs, the real key is to improve all revenue streams, so it gives us more scope to reinvest across the course, clubhouse, and general amenities. If we don't do this, it will negatively impact on Revenue in the years to come.

I understand that I am due to come back in the next month with some more detailed financial thoughts on where we are and what we might be able to do over the coming years.
