Mens Team News

These past weeks have been very busy with games coming thick and fast. The results have varied but every team put up a great effort. A sincere thank you to all managers and players.

One of the most challenging competitions is the **Senior Cup**, in which we only entered after a lot of soul searching as many teams can field so many scratch or better players, something that unfortunately we cannot do. To make things even more difficult we were matched with Castle, one of the best senior cup teams in Ireland. Their highest handicap was +1.9 which was Alan Lowry who was beaten on 19th by Mark Behan. We lost two matches on 18th, one on 17th and one called in on 18th. As the manager Paul Hautz said 'What a great performance by a Delgany team. I was very proud to be the manager of this team.' Coming from somebody as experienced and respected as Paul, this is a great accolade. This performance will give confidence for the future that we can offer this level of competition to our members.

Our **Junior Cup** team was pitted against Hermitage and again gave our club great heart winning by 4.5 to 0.5. This was a fantastic result played in atrocious conditions of nonstop rain both home and away. In our two home matches Declan Hanley won 2&1, after being 3 down, a birdie fest on the back nine winning the day while the youthful William Walshe won 6&5 showing that age is no barrier to overwhelming your opponent. In our three matches away. Liam May won 1 up - never more than 1 hole in it - solid as a rock, Conor McCarthy won 5&4 (against Hermitage's low man) (that's 6 away wins in a row in all inter club competitions) and finally Fergus McDonald was called in after 15 holes- 1 up at the time (only had 1 practice in Hermitage, on previous Thursday, in the rain. The manager Don Berkery said 'Many thanks to Fergus & Ross Nicoll, as they were late additions to the panel. Thanks to Ross & Rob Walshe (& Declan's buddy) for caddying, in the rain. Special thanks to Hermitage for their hospitality & excellent course setup. A true example for all other golf courses. It's Lisheen Springs up next & away again!!'

Our **Metropolitan Cup** team were not not to be outdone and had a great win against Kilmashogue winning 4:3.

Our **JB Carr** team has reached the **County Final** and played the first leg against Powerscourt away.

Delgany came away with 2 valuable wins out of 5 in the away leg of the Wicklow Final on the West Course in Powerscourt . The first pairing of Mike O'Brien and Frank Burke had a ding dong match with their opposition and went all the way to the 18th to clinch a very valuable win. They were 2 up with 2 to play only to lose the 17th . There was more drama to come after Delgany put their second shot in the water on the Par 5, 18th with Powerscourt putting theirs in the middle of the fairway. However Mike O'Brien put the 4th shot pin high just off the green while Powerscourt failed to reach the green with their third with the ball stopping just above the bunker with a difficult stance. The difficult chip onto the green only went half way while Frank Burke sank his putt from 20 feet for par and victory for Delgany. We had to wait for the final pairing of Don Berkery and Conor O'Riordan to win their match on the 17th after a tremendous match with their opposition to bring the overall match to a close with a 3/2 win for Powerscourt. The home leg in Delgany will be played on Friday 17th and plenty of support is required.

Delgany's **Pierce Purcell** put on a very brave showing but were edged out 2/3 by Druids Heath. We won our two home matches but in spite of a really gutsy performance by Don Berkery and Ciaran Daly (7 down, then fought back and eventually beaten on the 18th) could not take one in the Heath. Greg O'Neill who manages and helps out so many teams in Delgany sent out a number of teams. In the All Ireland Fourball his team went down to the wire. Having won two at home but unfortunately beaten on the 18th in the last match away. Greg gave special mention to Sean Farrell who was representing his club for the first time surpassed all expectations by playing super golf while partnering Ferghil Henderson on his debut. Greg had better luck in the **Powerscourt Cup** beating Blainroe, winning on the 19th hole at home.

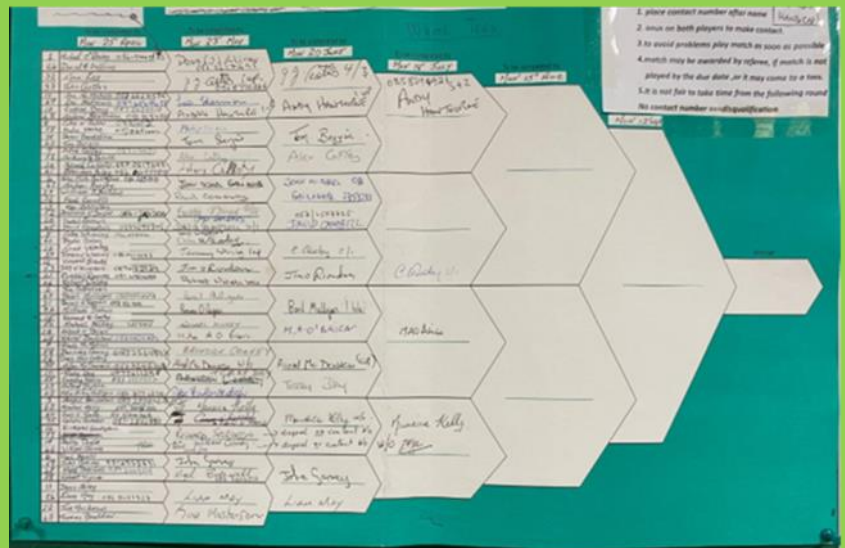
Singles Match Play 2022

The third round of the Singles Matchplay is nearing completion and we've seen some interesting results as we head into the quarter finals.

Andy Hawthorne has shown his ability by beating the very capable JJ Castles to move through to the next round where he will face either our Vice Captain Tom Bergin or Alex Coffey. That's a match that promises to be a sizzler....

The next match will see either John "Competitions" Gallagher or David Campbell face Colm Whooley. That'll be another interesting game to follow.

All the way from the Rebel County, Mike A. O'Brien has made it through to face either Alan McDonnell or the legendary Terry Day in our third quarter final. Quarter final number 4 will feature Maurice Kelly, who put in a very strong performance in this year's Winter League, against either John Garvey or Liam May. There are a lot of very interesting permutations in the mix, one of which could see a rematch between Terry Day and Alex Coffey in the final. But there's a long road to travel to get there.



Know the rules....

Unplayable ball.

John and Sue are playing the third hole and John pushes his drive into the trees on the left. When he gets to where his ball is he finds it stuck in the base of the tree. There is no way that he can move the ball legally so he has to tell Sue that he has an unplayable lie and asks what can he do about it.

As it's a rule question and not advice Sue can tell him what options he has. They are as follows:

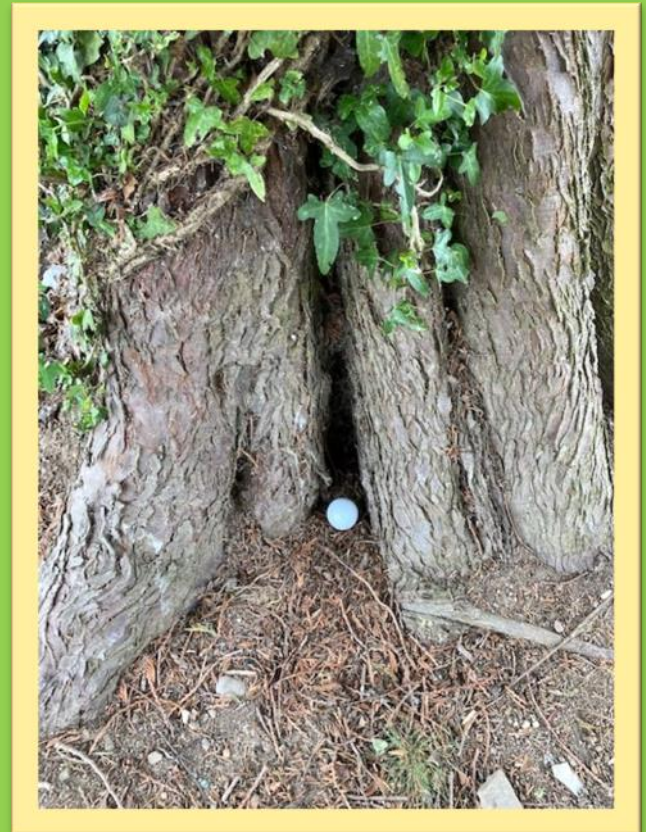
1. Go back to where he last hit the ball and play another or this ball with 1 penalty shot. That's 3 off the tee.
2. Drop a ball within two club lengths of where the ball lies but not nearer the hole. Penalty 1 shot, so playing 3 from there.
3. Going straight back in a line from the hole through the point where the ball lies as far back as you like and using this reference point drop a ball within one club length. Penalty 1 shot so playing 3.

John finds that 2 club lengths will just get him to where he can hit a shot, so taking that option he drops a ball from knee height and playing 3 hits a good shot 100 metres from the green.

Now if this had been a bunker you would still have the same 3 choices but if you choose no. 3 going back in line with flag, it would be a 1 shot penalty if dropped in bunker and 2 shots if dropped outside bunker.

We are reaching out to Members who have not signed up to the Club's Members Hub App, Called Club V1. We hope you will take the opportunity to download the app and register. If you are experiencing any difficulties registering please go to the instruction video below. The App, is feature rich and will become our central method of informing and communicating with our Members as it includes :

Course Status – Realtime updated course status maintained by the Office and Greenkeeper.

Latest News - Articles published by the Office become available, clicking the News shows the last ten News Items published.

Latest Competition Results – Maintained from closed competitions in ClubV1. We show either the Men's, Ladies or Mixed event. Clicking on the Results will display all competition results back to 1st January, 2022

BRS – Facility to book via BRS. This utilizes the single sign on and automatically logs the member into BRS.(This facility will go live shortly)

Handicap Index – Your current handicap index

Handicap List – List of all Members, and their Handicap Index.

Handicap Certificate – Powered by HowDidIDo, it is current, can be printed or shown from your phone when needed.

View Statistics - Logs you directly into HDID to give a fantastic summary of your performance.

Membership - Account balance displays the members subscription balance.

Bar & Restaurant – Displays the till balance, selecting each line item displays the till receipt (This data is personal to you and cannot be seen by other members).

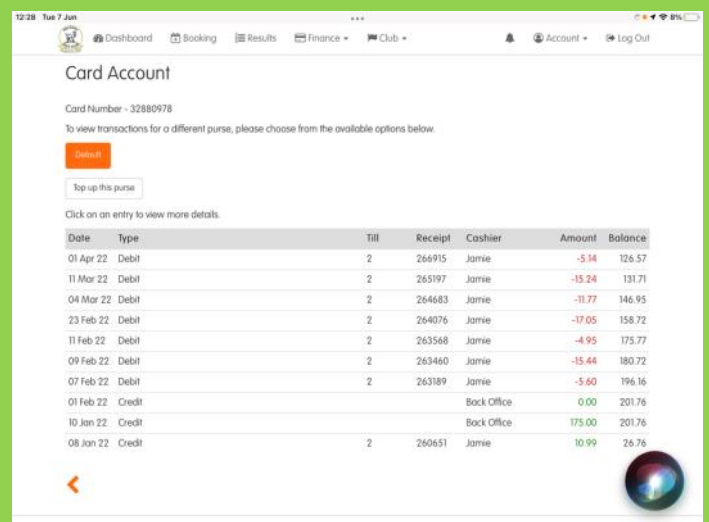
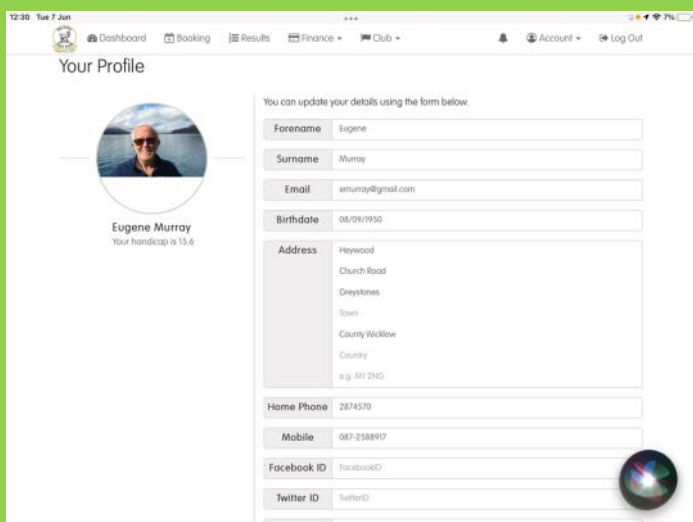
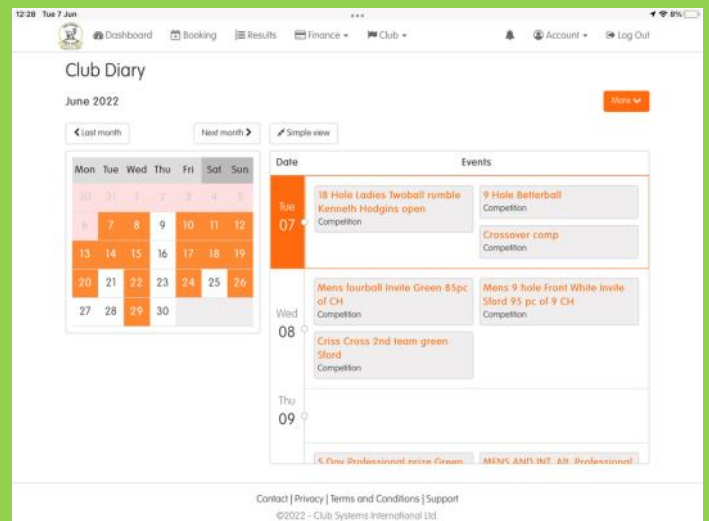
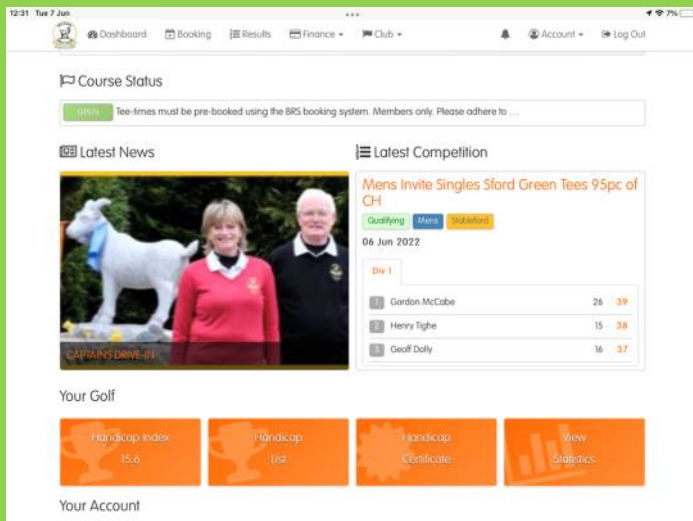
As can be seen this is a powerful facility for our Members whether you use a PC, Tablet or Smartphone it has great features to keep you informed.

Members can change their profile picture and contact details, by clicking on the photo place holder. Please upload a profile photo, it makes a difference.

Club V1 App

The Dashboard is the landing page after you login, it displays a wealth of information in relation to the Club, your account and your golf. Our systems talk to each other, for example, when the Competition Committee close a competition the results become instantly available on the Members Hub, your score is uploaded to Golf Ireland, HowDidIDo is updated and mail to Members issued. When you download the app and login using your HowDidIDo username and password

You can register your details. We encourage members to input some contact details so that they can be contacted by fellow members re timesheet and match issues. Even a photo helps other new members recognise you when they are on the timesheet with you. All data is only available to registered club members. Otherwise the only visible data on the system is all club members names and handicaps.

John Colgan remembered



I first met John Colgan in Oatlands College where I was a year ahead of John. We both joined the College unit of the FCA and had some great times mastering the art of soldiering. John struggled with Barrack Square drilling on the annual two week camps and inevitably found himself in the Cookhouse peeling potatoes. He was however a great shot and competed in a number of rifle competitions. I lost contact with John during the 1960s as we went our separate ways. However we met up again in the IDA which we both had joined in the early 1970s. John had a great career in the IDA and became a specialist in the Clothing and Textiles sectors. He loved international travel but at times struggled with local cuisine. He loved his job and was hugely committed to industrial development. He was married to Ann and they had a great relationship with plenty of foreign holidays and interesting places to visit.

During the late 1970s John encouraged me to join Delgany and together with Oliver Carty the three of us became 5 day members in 1978. John and Oliver had both been members of Bodenstown and both moved from Leixlip to Blackrock and Stillorgan. John was a serious golfer and played off 11 when he arrived in Delgany. He loved Delgany and all its characters of which he was one. He took to golf in Delgany like duck to water and would play as often as possible and soon moved up to full membership and weekend golf. John and Ann socialised frequently in Delgany provided Oliver Carty was doing the driving and became well known throughout the club. John loved the Delgany stories, gossip and yarns and loved to chat. One fine day after signing in on the time sheet John decided that it was time to replace his worn out golf umbrella and so he drops in to Jimmy Bradshaw and examines the stock of umbrellas and enquires from Jimmy the price of one of them. Jimmy looked at John and quoted him £10 where upon John decided to postpone the purchase. Some weeks later John arrives for golf and it starts to rain, so in he goes to Jimmy and makes his selection of umbrella and goes to Jimmy with his innocent question. How much is this one Jimmy? To which Jimmy responds -£15. John taken aghast, responds to Jimmy, but you said 3 weeks ago that it was £10. Unfazed Jimmy responds in deadpan language "it wasn't raining on that day". When I took up regular golf in Delgany in the mid 1990s it was John who encouraged me, tutored me and introduced me to so many Delgany members. John told me of an exchange he had with his playing partner (Dick Donnelly) on a Wednesday Fourball. John was in great form and looking forward to impressing his partner, so he informed Dick that he had a great score last weekend. Dick looking unimpressed responded to John, "I don't care what you scored last week, I only want to know, what are you going to do today?" He was extremely competitive and would put in the required practice including calling in to a Driving Range on the way home if he had problems with his driving. John represented Delgany on numerous Teams over the years. He won so many Christmas turkeys that he struggled to find homes for them.

John's wife Ann died in 2001 shortly after she took early retirement from Guinness. He was devastated by the loss and never fully recovered. He received great support from his sister Joan and Brother Paul. Shortly afterwards he decided to spend the winter in South Africa from November until April and it did him the world of good. It opened up a new life for him and he continued to spend time each year in South Africa and regularly met up with Delgany Members such as Sean Mason, Pat O'Neill, Michael Sinnott and Matt Farrell, played golf followed by dinner and wine. He suffered with dreadful arthritis over many years which really affected his golf and subsequently his mobility and agility.

About ten years ago, following a routine operation John picked up a sepsis infection which caused havoc with his body resulting in everlasting medical issues. It was a culmination of these problems which resulted in John's recent hospitalisation. Unfortunately his body was not strong enough to enable him recover and he passed away. John was always great company to be in, a good story teller, listener, a great interest in sport and a great love of golf. He will be missed around Delgany Golf Club.

Our summer program follows the U.S. Kids Golf Player Pathway that provides your young players a clear path to learning the game while having fun. Level 1 - 2 (ages 5-7) Fee: €89

Time: 11:30 to 12:30
