The Declan Clarke Charity Day - Friday September 2nd

The Declan Clarke Charity Day has been running now for twenty-six years without a break. Terry Day started it in 1996 to honour his great friend Declan who was undoubtedly one of Delgany's greatest golfers. The entrance fee for the day is €20.00 with all proceeds going to a local deserving Charity Greystones Cancer support. Over the years Terry has raised over € 100,000 and last year was able to present the charity with € 6,000.00.

The format for the day is a four person scramble open to guests and all members. The scramble will be followed by a Mix and Match which Gavin has kindly offered to sponsor allowing all proceeds to be donated to the charity.

A Tribute to Johnny May - Friday September 9th

Johnny May was one of the great characters of Delgany GC, not only a great golfer but a talented singer and entertainer who even in his 89th year had the youthful appearance of a much younger man . Johnny was one of six boys and five girls. Apart from Golf he was a talented soccer player playing for Bray Wanderers and at one stage moving to the Workman's Club in Dun Laoghaire much to the displeasure of his compatriots from Bray. The six May boys often fielded a seven a side soccer team with the help of another Delgany man Vincent Byrne in goal.

Johnny had a short spell at Molineux with Wolverhampton Wanderers under their great manager Stan Cullis, but after only three weeks Johnny issued the ultimatum that "this place isn't big enough for both of us "and as they say the rest is history.

Stuart Webster wrote a lovely article in the July Despatch paying tribute to Johnny, painting a lovely picture of his sunny personality and his many golfing triumphs. In that article Stuart mentioned that the Management Com-mittee had been looking for a way to recognise Johnny's huge contribution to Delgany when sadly he became ill and after a very short illness passed away.

Johnny's son Liam has very kindly offered to donate Johnny's very famous hickory shafted putter to the Club which will be mounted in a wooden case and placed in a prominent place for all to see. The putter will be presented by Liam to the Captain on the evening of the 9th of September. There will be a Mix and Match six ball followed by a meal and some entertainment courtesy of the great Phil O'Neill with Ian Barret providing some insights into what the life of Johnny May was. The six ball will kick off at 4.30pm and will be a shotgun start. It's a 9 hole competition and is run as a scotch foursome or Sixsome with three pairs in each team. Its quicker than you would think and is good fun with a lot of bodies visible on the course.

The time sheet cannot accommodate six names so when booking put one name down for each pair.

We hope to get a great crowd out so put it in your diary now. If the front nine fills up, we will open some holes on the back 9 so we should be able to get everyone out that wants to play.

Mark Wyse as usual is very kindly sponsoring the prizes so that all proceeds will again go to the Greystones cancer support group. It is fitting as Terry Day had been great pals with Johnny May since they were boys.

Delgany Website and the ClubV1 App.


