Maura Devereux (by Judy Brennan)



Maura was the most wonderful and engaging lady. She joined Delgany Golf Club in the early 1940's and was a valued and much loved member for 80 years. Her father, William Deely, joined the club in 1942 and brought 5 of his glamorous daughters, Breda, Maura, Kay, Anne and Peggy, all of whom were long term members. Peggy and Anne were past Lady Captains, and Maura and Peggy Honorary Life Members. Their brother Bill was Captain for 2 years in the 1960s. Maura was a fantastic pianist and contributed greatly to social events in the club during the 40's, 50's 60's, 70's,

80's, 90's and 2000's. She was always available for the frequent sing-songs which were such a great part of the social scene in the club over these decades.

In Delgany, Maura met her future husband, Michael Devereux. They had a long and extremely happy marriage, both were closely involved in the golfing and social life of the club. At one stage, 40 members of the extended Deely family, also known as "the Mafia", were members in the club - Deely's, Devereuxs, Brennans, Bakers, Hearnes and MacKeoghs to name a few. The family were all involved in the golfing life of the club, from Senior Cup and Ladies Senior Foursomes down.





Maura was a very good golfer and supported numerous teams over the years. The highlight was the Townsend Cup (Senior Foursomes) which the club won in 1974 - all 6 ladies in the final were members of "the Mafia". She continued to play and enjoy her golf up to a few years ago, hitting the ball straight down the middle of the fairway. Maura went every year to San Francisco to see her son Louis up until 3 years ago, travelling alone but always with her golf clubs in tow.

Last year for her 99th birthday the Lady Captain arranged a fabulous afternoon tea for Maura and her family and friends. During the tea, Maura entertained all the ladies with her virtuoso performance on the piano accompanied by her son John on the flute.





In March, Maura celebrated her 100th birthday with 99 members of her family and friends in Delgany Golf Club and once again payed the piano. Unfortunately, Maura died one month later. Delgany Golf Club was at the centre of the celebration of her long life, with wonderful music at her funeral and later in the club. Maura would have approved!!

We send our heartfelt condolences to Bridgette, John and Louis on their great loss. I will miss her greatly, to me she was a wonderful friend, aunt and godmother.

In addition to Judy's excellent piece on Maura, Captain Betty has provided us with this interesting article from a local newspaper mentioning Maura's early participation in Delgany's social scene. Captain of the Club at the time was Maura's brother, Dr Bill Deely, and it sounds like they knew how to throw a hooley! If there were a census taken of the best-dressed women in Ireland, I'm sure Pat Whyte of Shankhill would be placed in the first ten. For elegance, economy of line, absolute discretion in the use of jewellery and a superb figure, this absurdly young-looking mother of two teenagers and an eightyear-old takes a lot of beating. Before her marriage to auctioneer Frederick W. Whyte she worked with one of Ireland's leading couturieres, and she still likes to design her children's clothes.

Pat was one of a happy crowd at Delgany Golf Club recently when this sociable club held a hooley. There are three hundred members and the golf course scenically is one of the most charming in the country.

Today we talk to Sinead Fitzgerald....
