An Irish International, Australia and the Ferguson Memorial Salver

Teddys tale.

The office was contacted last week by Donall Gannon, ex Chairperson of Greystones Rugby Football Club with a request. He explained that on the day of the Ireland - England match last Saturday, the IRFU would award caps to 17 players who featured for Ireland but were not awarded caps at the time for games which were not then recognised as International Test Matches.

Amongst the recipients was a Raphael Edward Coolican (known as **Teddy**) who played against France in 1946. Born in England to Irish parents, Teddy studied medicine at Trinity College and excelled in many sports, especially rugby. After graduating he settled in Australia where he had a distinguished medical career. Equally distinguished was his rugby genes, as his son John played for New South Wales and Australia, including winning caps against New Zealand and France, while his grandson Tom (a son of Myles) was capped 8 times by the USA!

The Delgany connection

Donall confirmed that while in Ireland Teddy lived in the Delgany area and whenever he took a break from his studies, he was likely to be found in **Delgany Golf Club**. At the time we had a close relationship with Dublin University (TCD), evidenced by some photographs in the clubhouse (see 'Dublin University V Delgany Mountaineers'). In fact, the Club's association with Trinity goes back to our founding members, including members of the Robertson family who lived locally on Struan Hill.

In the hall there is a photo of Captain Clement Robertson, who was killed in combat during the First World War and was awarded a Victoria Cross. A Civil Engineer, Clement graduated from Trinity College in 1909 and it is no coincidence that the black, red, and green colours associated with Delgany are almost identical to the colours found in the Trinity college ties and scarves of that era.

Donall was able to tell me that Teddy Coolican had won the Ferguson Memorial in 1947 and his name was engraved on a silver salver that he hoped was still in existence. It is, and he was delighted as Teddy's sons, John and Myles, along with family members, were travelling to Ireland last weekend, when at an official reception the IRFU would present John with his late father's international cap.



Therefore, last Friday evening, just as Storm Betty was settling in, the Coolican group arrived in the clubhouse and Patrick Bradshaw and I were able to show them photographs, provide some stories and Delgany history of that time and of course, the treasured Ferguson Memorial salver itself.



Refreshments were had and the family was delighted to be in a place close to Teddy's heart when he was a young man. The happy photograph shows John (left) and Myles holding the Ferguson Memorial salver and afterwards, a message from Donall assured me their Delgany visit was a special and poignant moment for the family.

As for the Fergson Memorial, there is enough material here for another article! Born in Belfast, Robert Campbell Ferguson was an outstanding student, educated at the Mercantile College, Belfast, and Queens University Belfast. In January 1920 he joined the Department of Labour in Dublin and later transferred to the Irish Free State Department of Industry and Commerce where he proved to be a dynamic and brilliant administrator, rising to the top job of Department Secretary.

A close acquaintance of the larger-than-life RM Smyllie (Editor of the Irish Times and to all intents and purposes, Mr. Delgany), Ferguson retired on the 31st of July 1945 and unfortunately died on the 17th hole less than one week later. His close friends decided to have an annual competition in his memory and R.E. Coolican, Trinity College medical student and Irish international, was the 2nd winner of the Ferguson Memorial in 1947.

The 2023 competition is scheduled for Saturday the 16th of September and the winner will take his place in the wonderful history of our Club!



The Delgany Artisans are the 2023 Irish Artisan Golf Association (IAGA) Interclub Winners after a magnificent comeback in the home leg of the 2legged final, played against Killiney GC on Sunday 13th August last.

Consisting of 5 pairings and played in fourball format, Delgany was trailing 3.5 to 1.5 from the away fixture (one match was called a half as darkness prevented any further play on the 20th hole). Needing four



matches out of five for victory, this is precisely what they did, with Jim Brady and Eddie Byrne winning the decisive point on the 2^{nd} tie hole.

The Delgany Artisans section have a proud tradition in interclub golf and they were determined that 2023 would be their year. Pictured above is the delighted winning group of management and team.

Irish Artisans have always had a reputation for producing good golfers and probably the most famous was Tom Craddock. Twice a Walker Cup player, he won five championships, becoming the first artisan golfer to play amateur golf for Ireland in 1955 (he worked as a greenkeeper at Malahide GC at the time) and went on to work alongside Pat Ruddy to create such renowned courses as Druids Glen and the Glashedy links at Ballyliffin. Part of the fabric of Irish golf for 50 years until his death in 1998 and a great supporter of Irish Artisan golfers.

Well done to all who donated.


