New membership applications are currently being accepted for these categories and in most cases the period from Application being received to you playing golf will only take two weeks. This will allow you to take part in competitions within weeks (subject to handicap) and begin enjoying the wonderful facilities the club has to offer our members.

 Five-day membership is based on play during Monday – Friday.

All new members are subject to a once off entrance fee that may be paid over five years or a special discount of 20% if paid at election.



Unfortunately the wet weather continues and the Autumnal conditions have arrived much sooner than expected. It really has been such a disappointing year, weather wise. The fairway cut height has been raised to 19mm (from the summer height of 15mm) and placing in September is way earlier that we would have liked. Needs must.

<u>The 9th tee</u>

We are in the process of finalising the project to remove the concrete plinth. The tall trees surrounding the 9th tee inhibit grass growth and therefore a permanent mat is needed to ensure playability all year round. However, the installation of the artificial playing surface last year met with much comment and debate.

We reviewed its functioning over a period



including taking advice from our agronomist. A more practical solution that is both aesthetically in keeping with the area and doesn't represent a health and safety risk is being implemented.

The plan is to remove the concrete plinth and return this area to a shade resistant grass that will be available for use next season. In addition, we discovered that there is an additional problem with the existing tee as there is a soil layer, 40 mm below the surface, which negatively affects the strength and performance of the existing grass. This layer prevents healthy rooting and limits wear capacity of the grass. We are going to remove an estimated 60mm of the contaminated root zone, level the surface and replace the full tee with this the shade resistant grass.

Some weeks ago we cleared out the shrubbery around the magnificent trees on the righthand side of the tee, which had the added bonus of opening up the beautiful vista towards the 12th tee and 11th green. This bank will be returned to grass. This has the added bonus of also improving air circulation. Further tree surgery is required to bring the drip line back away from the tee and reduce shading.

These changes and additions will ensure healthier and stronger grass on this tee box.





Both mats will be relocated, on the right hand side, in front of the existing tee. The two mats will be laid side by side and flush with the grass in their new built up location. The idea of using the two mats is to ensure plenty of playing and standing room so the grass tee will be fully protected. A new short walkway, from the tarmac path to the mat, will be installed. See sketch.

Sourse update

This location ensures that the remainder of the tee can be rested from play and traffic while the mat is in play. To that end, whether using a buggy or walking, please use the tarmac path to access the tee.

This important project will commence, as soon as is practical and when weather conditions permit. We estimate it will take up two weeks to complete this work and we will use the lower tee for this period.

Thank you for your patience in this matter and we hope this planned improvement meets with the approval of our members.
