Update on our greens

It was noticeable last weekend that the surface of our greens were slightly disimproved on the recovery seen in recent weeks following aeration (hollowing coring). As part of our Autumn maintenance programme an overseeding was recommended by our agronomist in conjunction with the hollow coring (to minimise disruption). This is an expensive process that we are reintroducing as part of our long term goals to improve the consistency and performance of our greens.

The greens were seeded with a mix of two types of finer grasses to improve the surface. However due to inclement weather conditions this had to be delayed by the contractor on a number of occasions in recent weeks. This important work finally took place last week (as greens were coming back to normal) and the slits where the seeds are dropped, unfortunately disrupted the surface leading to bumpy conditions last weekend.

We have worked on improving the roll, this week again and with light sanding we are confident there will be a good recovery as we go forward. The good news is that we were delighted also to see the warmer temperatures as this is a major help to germination of the grass seed, given how late in the season we got this process completed. We have already been able to see some seed-lings poking through.

The recent weather conditions have also though contributed to a high disease risk period also, with moist ground and warm air conditions which can accelerate plant diseases. So right now the course staff are being extra vigilant and have taken steps using a preventative spray product to reduce the risk.

In recent weeks there has also been some disruption to our grass cutting schedule on both fairways and the rough, due to the continued and relentless rain that we experienced in recent months. This rain fall has totalled 334mm for the 3 months of July, August and September. This is fully 55% more than the same period last year and 63% above the long term average for these 3 months. This is a serious amount of extra rain and means we are entering the autumn / winter period way more soft and damp than normal. It led to a number of fairways being left uncut last week, due to the heavy ground conditions, but in recent days we are getting back on schedule. All inland courses are facing the same challenges.

We hope members understand the importance of these processes taking place and thank you for your patience during this recovery period.


