Captains' Message

Course News



<u>Aerator</u>

Our new John Deere pedestrian aerator has now arrived. This aerator is a pedestrian machine which is easier to operate and more efficient. We are replacing a 2007 (16-year-old) tractor mounted aerator which is obsolete at this stage, and not only slow but, more importantly, could damage the greens. In recent years, we have used a contractor to do our hollow coring and while this has worked well, it is expensive.

This machine will allow us to do our twice-yearly hollow coring & our monthly solid tining. This will enable us to do more regular tining and to include the approaches and tees. Having our own aerator will enable us to be more flexible with the weather and timing of the use of our aerator as against having to work with the set dates of a contractor.

This is an absolutely key piece of course equipment. This pedestrian machine can be used through the winter months which will improve the quality and drainage of the areas we use it on.

The benefits of aeration include:

Reducing compaction and improving surface performance Providing better penetration of water and air Allowing fertiliser / nutrients to reach into the root zone Improving soil structure and rooting capacity Extending playability
Releasing toxic gases from the soil Increasing shoot growth



The arrival of this new aerator is another step in the rebuilding of our key course fleet. This builds on the new fairway mower and roughs mower that we purchased within the last 12 months. This is real progress and while we still have major capital requirements, this represents serious advancement.

I would like to acknowledge our Captains, Tom and Betty and our Treasurer, Colm, our General Manager, Patrick and the Management Committee for their support in this progress.







Avoid Walking on the Fairways

The continued wet weather, caused by 3.5 months of exceptional rain, which was a full 55% above the long-term average for the same period, has caused the course to be unusually wet and where the 'going' is soft to heavy in too many places. Delgany has experienced 136mm (or over 5 inches) of extra rain during this period and there is no letup in sight.

As a result of this rain, the fairways are in soft condition and will be damaged further until some drying and growth return. Apart from the health and safety implications where slips and falls are a risk, which are exacerbated by our slopes and hills, the high footfall due to competition entries & general play will further impair our fairways and green surrounds.

With this in mind, we are reintroducing the rules that were so well supported last Winter and which were so successful.

- **1.** All players must avoid walking on the fairways as much as possible. Therefore, we require each golfer to walk in the rough and if your ball is on the fairway, then you are allowed, at 90 degrees, to walk the shortest distance to your ball, play your shot and return to the rough. This includes bringing your divot bag so you can repair your divot.
- **2**. The ropes, white lines and hoops are there to protect the course. All players must observe these at all times as these are key defences in preventing further damage.
- **3.**The repairing of each and every divot is a huge part of keeping our course in decent condition. We have seen the huge support from our members in this regard. However, there are still many unrepaired divots that must be fixed.

Therefore, it remains compulsory for <u>every player</u> to use a divot bag and to repair each divot you take. We would very much appreciate if players would repair other divots that you come across on the course as well. There are many refill stations available to replenish the sand. Please assist your playing partners by reminding them to take a divot bag and to use it.

We need each member to take individual responsibility to reinforce these rules so that every-body contributes to the protection of our course, and this includes those who choose to carry their clubs. These actions are necessary to reduce further damage to our course while these soft conditions prevail. However, they are also good housekeeping practices which will benefit us all in the long term. The improvements that were seen this Summer prove these actions work.

Thank you all in advance for your continued cooperation and support for these measures.

We committed to marking out a buggy path for use on marginal weather days over the winter period. These are days when buggies would ordinarily not be allowed due to the soft course.

This blue post buggy path is the new route designed and must be used by buggy drivers on these days. If the Club were macadam pathways, this blue track is where the routing would predominantly lie. It is unfortunate that we are entering the winter period in such soft conditions. The rain fall has totalled 334mm for the 3 months of July, August and September. This is fully 55% more than the same period last year and 63% above the long term average for these 3 months. This is a serious amount of extra rain and means the course is entering the autumn / winter period way more soft and damp than normal. Unfortunately October is not showing any change in the weather pattern and all inland courses are facing the same challenges.

We have now laid out the blue posts on the driest route available to us. This will mean crossing some fairways and to assist we have also cut the grass lower to identify this route. We have a number of directional signs as well and more will be added shortly. It is important that each buggy driver familiarises themselves with this route and tries to use it even on days when it is not called into operation. The idea is that you aim at the blue post and then the next blue post. It is imperative that buggy drivers stick to this route. If there is significant deviation from this route then this buggy path will not work and all buggy drivers will lose out. Feedback on how this route works is welcome.

I would like to take this opportunity to remind all our buggy drivers, especially in the soft conditions we are experiencing, that they MUST NOT drive their buggies within 10 yards of any tee, bunker or green. Unfortunately there are many instances when this key rule is not adhered to. In addition, please use the existing tarmac paths at all times.

As you will gather, this system will require members using buggies to walk to their ball from the blue route, this is unavoidable in many places, we cannot allow buggies to cross onto fairways in places other than where the route directs. The route is designed to both protect the course and offer the buggy golfers an opportunity to play, it may not however suit everyone. This is the first time we have introduced such a blue post buggy path for the marginal 'weather' days and this will be kept under review and adjustments made as needed.

We need the cooperation of all buggy drivers to make this work.

On behalf of the Course Committee

Players must walk in the rough and avoid walking on the fairways as much as possible.

Use the 90-degree rule to walk the shortest distance to your ball on the fairway.

WINTER RULES - PLACING ON FAIRWAYS & ROUGH:

Placing on the Fairway and in the Rough has been introduced until March 2024. The ball can be placed within 6 inches and not nearer the hole. Fringe pitch marks can be repaired but note the rule explained below before doing so!

Please note that placing does NOT include Bunkers where you must play as the ball lies.

Also, "sand and soil" can be removed from the green only but nowhere else.

N.B. If you are looking for a ball you must observe the <u>3-minute rule</u> and respect other players by declaring the ball lost after this time is up.

GENERAL PLAY ROUNDS:

General play rounds for handicap purposes are suspended until after the Winter season. We will advise you when they will be reinstated in 2024.

RULES THAT PLAYERS GET WRONG:

For the next few weeks I will highlight a rule that golfers regularly get wrong...

Repairing Ball Marks:

You can repair ball marks on the green at any time but you CANNOT repair a ball mark on the fringe if it's on your line. So, for example if you are on the fringe and fancy putting it, but there is a deep pitch mark on your line in the fringe, you cannot repair that.

You can repair them if they are NOT on your line and not interfering with your line of play though.
