#### PLAYING OFF MATS

You may not be aware of it but when mats are in play, you **<u>must</u>** play off them. You cannot tee your ball up in an area off the mat as the penalty for doing so is 2 shots!!

#### **RULES THAT PLAYERS GET WRONG:**

#### **Provisional Ball**

Many golfers think that once they hit a provisional ball, then their first act should be to look for the first ball, but that's not necessarily the case.

If, for example, you top the provisional ball to a distance short of where the first ball went, you can continue to play the provisional ball until you get to that area.

Once you reach the point where the first ball went, though, you have to stop playing the provisional. If you play the provisional beyond that point, it will then becomes the ball in play.

#### TEN YEAR MEMBERSHIP OFFER

- 1. The offer is available to Ordinary Members only.
- 10-year membership is available on receipt of an upfront payment of €13,500, made as a single payment.
- The offer is for the annual subscription fee only, all levies and other charges will fall due each year over the 10-year period.
- 4. The offer is limited to five memberships only.

#### Vincent Leonard: An appreciation

I have known Vincent or Vinny since he took up golf almost 40 years ago. An avid sportsman, Vinny played soccer with Brighton Celtic and GAA with Foxrock Geraldines (later to become Geraldine Morans). As his playing days ended, he decided to try his hand at golf and there started a life long addiction. His decision was no doubt influenced by his friends in his local pub 'The Magic Carpet' in Cornelscourt (including one Michael Sinnott of DGC). At the time, golf membership was not easily accessible, most pubs had golf societies and 'the carpet' was no exception. A highlight of the society was an annual trip to Dooks GC in Glenbeigh Co Kerry and it was there that Vinny recorded his first 'Hole in One' and no better man to celebrate his success. Needless to say his hole in one left him with a big hole in his pocket but it cemented his love of the game!

Vinny joined Kilternan GC and his game improved to the point where he was a regular 12 handicapper and had his name in the frame on many occasions. Sadly, Kilternan closed and for a number of years he moved around different clubs (Powerscout, Lisheen Springs, Dublin Mountain and Glen of the Downs) before finally settling at Delgany. I have lost count of the number of golfing trips made with Vinny, but they include Spain, Portugal, France and most of Ireland including his beloved Dooks in Kerry. I recall one evening on a Portuguese golf trip, the group were out for dinner in Villamoura and we ordered wine for the table. Needless to say, on such occasions nobody was counting and after more than a few hours of sorting out the rights and wrongs of the day, Vinny raised his glass. We all expected a toast to someone else's misfortune as he just looked up at the glass and said the immortal words: 'Isn't red wine great, I always feel more intelligent when I drink it' !!!!

At Delgany, Vinny always felt at home and loved the atmosphere on and off the course. He won the Bellevue Cup (pictured right) and has successfully represented teams over the years (sadly missing out on the Powerscourt Cup final through illness, having played a winning role in previous games). Vincent was a great man to take on new challenges, having developed his talent for a song or two, he took up the guitar a few years ago and was fast becoming a one man show!. At the same time he took to acting in Delgany GC, thanks to Jim Blake and the drama group. He was a natural and his portrayal of Matty in 'Nobody's talking to me' was a highlight that gave him immense satisfaction and us much hilarity as he 'was' Matty with us at times.





Without hesitation Vinny would always offer to help out and earlier this year he volunteered for the course clean up group. He used to tell us that the work was good for the soul and he loved the camaraderie that came with it.... that was Vinny, always willing to help out and always up for a game of golf. No stranger to winning, both Frank Burke and myself always knew we had to bring our 'A' game every week if we were to squeeze a cent off Vinny as he was a great competitor.

A devoted family man, Vincent leaves behind his wife Anna, sons Ruairí and Seán as well as a huge number of friends across the many different interests he had. Vin-

cent's family would like to thank the Captain and all the members of Delgany Golf Club who attended his funeral mass, it was very much appreciated and a great comfort to them.

Enjoy the fairways of heaven Vincent, our many happy memories of you will never fade.
