Course Report



Course report January 2024

Sadly the constant storms have taken their toll on our Delgany trees: A mature Scotch Pine on the right hand side of the 13th approximately 80 feet high has fallen due to the wind and continual wet weather. As can be seen from the photo the tree was uprooted rather than broken.



Other major boughs from trees on the drive and at the side of the 3rd tee have broken off and lots of broken branches have fallen all around the course due to storm force winds.

Entrance avenue:

The continual rain and heavy outbursts have caused major flooding on the avenue and washing stones and grit onto the avenue which normally would be washed into the drains on either side of the tarmac. Outlet pipes and drains have had to be flushed and washed using high powered machinery rented from an outside contractor. The green keepers have been removing debris and silt from the side drains using the digger and physical labour and is extremely time consuming. We ask members to drive only on the tarmac and do not drive on the side drains for their own safety and to avoid damaging the soft ground.

COMPETITION ENTRY

If you decide to play the Winter League competition on Friday please ensure that you sign into the correct competition. It's the **SATURDAY ALT** competition. **Not** the **FRIDAY ONLY** competition. The Winter League is a weekend competition played on Saturday &/or Sunday, depending on the competition schedule. The ALT competition on Friday is provided to facilitate eligible members who can't get on the Saturday timesheet or who prefer to play their Winter League competition on Friday. We have included a note on the Competition Entry Computer to remind you that you need to enter the correct competition. It is the player's responsibility to enter the correct competition.

The option to enter the Saturday ALT competition on Friday applies to many other Saturday competitions throughout the year - it isn't just for the Winter League.

RULES THAT PLAYERS GET WRONG:

Ball played from outside teeing area:

Match Play Rule 6.1b(1)

When starting a hole, if you play a ball from outside the teeing area (including from a wrong set of tee markers on the same hole or a different hole), in match play, there is no penalty and you play your ball as it lies, however your opponent may cancel the stroke in which case you must play again from *inside the teeing area*.

Stroke Play Rule 6.1b (2):

When starting a hole, if you play a ball from outside the teeing area (including from a wrong set of tee markers on the same hole or a different hole), in stroke play, the ball is not in play. You get the **general penalty** (two penalty strokes) and you must correct the mistake by playing a ball from inside the teeing area.

If you do not correct the mistake before starting the next hole you are disqualified.

Those were the days...



This year we are introducing a new section to look back at the Club's great players and characters that are part of Delgany GC folklore. The idea is to get our senior members to share their stories and add some background about some of the names that are part of the club history. We begin with the story of 'ANDY THE EAGLE' **thanks to Derek Mulrooney** with some help from lan Byrne:

I visited Andy Byrne before Christmas in his retirement home at St Josephs, Crinken Lane, Shankill. We had a pleasant chat about Delgany G.C and his adventures as a driver /guide for Bord Failte after his retirement from Guinness.

Andy was born in a house in Woodstock Estate, Newtownmountkennedy on what we now know as Druids Glen Golf Resort and moved as a boy with his Family to Killincarrig, where I first got to know him.

He was a great sports man and played hurling, Gaelic football, soccer and golf with his pal Dave Fox. Both had similar sports achievements except Andy did not try rugby.

In the days when it was not easy to play soccer and GAA at the same time, Andy scored the winning goal for Bray Wanderers in the Leinster Senior League Final, won two Gaelic Football Finals and one hurling final with Eire Og, Greystones. The other Delgany G.C Members of the GAA Teams were Paddy O'Kelly, Capt and his two brothers, Dave Fox, John Byrne, Declan Clarke, Derek Mulrooney, the local priest Fr McAuliffe and Brother Bolger. Unfortunately, there is no photograph of the hurling team as Archbishop John Charles McQuaid did not allow his priests or brothers to play these competitive games!!!!




Those were the days...



Andy's success's on Delgany Golf Teams are too many to mention including the Barton Cup and the Scratch Cup (also won by his son Ian). To give an example of the mans prowess, he stopped counting his 'hole in ones' after 15 of those rare treats.

Andy found a new and very successful career after retirement when he worked as a driver /guide for Bord Failte handling foreign TV Crews and journalists.



One such journalist was Goran Zachrisson from Sweden (pictured above) who was to Nordic Golf TV what Peter Alliss was to BBC Golf. As a top golf journalist writing for 'Svensk Golf', Goran travelled the great golf courses of Ireland with our Andy, playing golf and writing stories. Their adventures were many, of which Goran regularly mentioned in his TV commentaries whether he was at The Open, the Masters or European PGA Tournaments.

The big question often asked by Nordic Golfers was "who is this Andy the eagle, the Irish golfer whom Goran speaks about on TV?" This was great publicity for Irish Golf Tourism and shows the lasting impact Andy made on his Swedish friend.

Why "Andy the Eagle"? It was a beautiful late spring bright morning in Rosslare Links Golf Club when Andy arrived with a bus load of Northern European golf journalists en route to the Irish Open in Mt. Juliet G.C. One journalist's flight was delayed so we were short one player to make up six

four balls playing singles and fourball at the request of the visitors. Andy was asked to play but true to form he had to be coaxed due to the super Irish breakfast awaiting him in the Club House. The loop off the white tees for the day was ten holes and Andy shot four pars, five birdies and an eagle (7 under par for ten holes).

The journalists were amazed, and the editor of the Norwegian golf magazine went home and commissioned the top cartoonist of the National News Paper Aftenposten, to produce the cartoon entitled "Andy the Eagle" as you will see in this photo.

Today, the original of the cartoon is proudly treasured by his son Ian Byrne (DGC member)


