Captains' Message

Nevertheless, our course staff and the members (by walking in the rough and the use of sandbags) have done their best to get us out and playing whenever possible, and hopefully we can look forward to a long, hot summer.

But before we leave winter, a mention about the Winter League which is reaching its closing stages. The last qualifying rounds are this weekend, and it looks like Captain Ian and last year's Captain Tom's teams are safely through to the semi-finals with "all to play for" for the 5 or 6 teams also in contention. Many thanks to the organisers especially Alan McDonnell for his trojan work in collating all scores every weekend and getting the results and state of play out to the Managers and their team members.

Breaking news on and off the course!



Doreen Brennan

Joining Delgany in 1961, Doreen won many trophies and 3 Lady Captains' prizes. She played on many teams including the winning Townsend Cup team, the Senior Cup and together with Anne Gaynor, she also won the Daily Mail Irish Foursomes, going on to represent Ireland.

In 1980, Doreen captained the Senior Alliance where she represented Delgany for many years. She was a fantastic ambassador for the club, rubbing shoulders with Lein-



ster's golfing elite, she had a very high profile in both ladies and mixed golf circles, while fostering good relations with many other clubs. As a result of Doreen's high standing within the ILGU many prestigious competitions were brought to Delgany for the first time.

Doreen was Lady Captain in 1971 and in appreciation of her enormous contribution to the club, was invited to become an honorary life member in 2021. She played most of her golfing career off 4 and holds the ladies' record for the old course. In 2022, aged 90, she lead the field after Day 1, with a score of 65 off a handicap of 21.

Doreen was a camogie player of note before joining Delgany. As noted in Wikipedia, in 1960 Doreen became the first player in camogie history to captain her side to victory in both the All Ireland Camogie Championship and the Gael Linn Cup for inter-provincial teams in the same year. She won 4 All Ireland senior medals playing for Dublin in 1957, 1958, 1959 and 1960. Around the same time she also won 3 interprovincial medals and 2 intervarsity cups playing for UCD.

Apart from her sporting achievements Doreen had a challenging job as Senior Chemist in the State Laboratory. After 13 years as a Trustee, Doreen resigned this year, prompting an opportunity to say thank you to her for everything she has done for Delgany and to congratulate her on an outstanding sporting career.



-MOVING TO 15-HOLES & 18-HOLES:

The plan is to move to 15 holes on Wednesday, March 6th., subject to confirmation by the Course Staff.

Similarly, we plan to move to 18 holes a fortnight later on Wednesday, March 20th (to be confirmed).

CARING FOR OUR COURSE:

Please note that we are still playing under Winter conditions and we would gently remind all players with trollies (of ANY type) that you are obliged to walk in the rough with them (on either side of the fairway). Multiple reports have been received of players dragging/pushing their trollies across fairways to play their shots. You must park your trolly in the rough and in line with where your ball lies, if on the fairway. Decide what club you need and just take it over to play your shot.

Also, pitch marks are not being repaired on greens – it only takes a few seconds and is so important.

UNCLAIMED PRIZES:

This year we are introducing a new process whereby any (physical) prizes which are unclaimed 2 weeks after the date of the competition will be used for another competition. Please note that you can nominate someone else to collect your prize if you cannot. Alternatively, you should email competitions@delganygolfclub.com to arrange a collection date as soon as possible after the competition.

COMPETITION RESULTS:

As previously advised, Competition Results are not final until published on the 'Latest Results' section of the members website. Results on HowDidIDo publish automatically when the competition closes. However, a result is NOT official until the physical cards have been checked and the result posted on the Delgany website. The checking of the cards may result in the finishing order changing in the event of a tie and a countback.

Go to competitions section of our Club website and you can check for final results.

The results are also printed and displayed in the Men's Changing Room.

Finally, we would ask you to do us the courtesy of keying in your score on the hallway computer after all your rounds in ALL competitions. It's not too much to ask and helps all of us to collate scores accurately. Thank you...
