Captains' Message



On the Interclub front the Fitzgibbon Cup team has come up just short in terms of qualifying from a very difficult group, but Tom Bergin and his management team is happy that some promising partnerships have emerged, and expectations remain high that Delgany is forming a strong Barton Cup panel this year. The last match in the Fitzgibbon is also on Sunday next, the 24th, versus a strong Castle opponent, and the team and management would be delighted to do their best in front of Delgany support.

Away from team golf, big news is that the Revenue Committee has announced a major campaign to raise funds for a much-needed upgrade of our lovely avenue. The primary focus will be on drainage works, and when complete, landscaping of what is a tremendous feature of Delgany. The initiative, in the form of a President's Draw (President Kennedy has kindly allowed his name to be used to promote the campaign!), will be launched at the Drive-In on Saturday 23rd March, with full details to follow.

Congratulations are also due to our team who launched our Delgany Bees initiative, as the club recently received a Sustainable Development 2023 Award from Wicklow County Council. We have an opportunity for anyone interested in learning from our expert bee keepers, so keep reading this buzzing issue for more details!

The first of two information meetings for the One Club Framework took place on the 5th of March last, and a large turnout listened to an hour-long presentation , which included excellent insight

from Neil Kilgannon of Golf Ireland. The 2nd meeting takes place next Wednesday, 20th March, in the Dining Room at 8pm.

Finally, we are looking forward to our Captains' Drive-In next Saturday and we look forward to meeting as many members and friends throughout what promises to a be a fun day from early to late! The morning and afternoon timesheets are full, however, there are a small number of places still available for dinner that night, with fine fare, great music and entertainment lined up so don't delay, contact Jamie or Kevin.







<u>Greens</u>

Our greens are cut Twice a week and to a height of 4mm. The holes are clipped daily and are changed on average two to three times a week depending on wear and tear. Aeration of the greens using a 10mm pencil tine relieving compaction and improving surface performance and the plan is to sand greens every couple of weeks in order to improve quality and achieve consistency throughout the year.

<u>Tees</u>

Our tee boxes are mowed when conditions will allow and are currently cut at 16mm. They have recently received a liquid feed and an iron application. We heavy divot tee boxes currently once a week and by resting the tees and using the winter mats as much as possible, they should be in good condition heading into the growing Season.

<u>Fairways</u>

Our fairways are cut when conditions allow and shaping of Fairways has commenced. The height of cut is currently at 19 mm walking in the rough has had huge benefits going into the golfing season. Verti Draining was scheduled for 14th March but was postponed due to the wet ground. Verti Draining and Sanding of fairways will increase over the next couple of years to improve the quality.

Miscellaneous

Thanks to **Siobhan Mooney** for organizing the spraying of all Tee Markers this month. Walkways and the blue buggy path have been sanded to increase playability on the course. Edging of the bunkers has now been complete. Strimming of the banks at the first tee box and around the chipping area has been completed in addition the tee posts have also been maintained. At the 6th tee box, we removed the rotten sleepers as a safety measure and repaired with top soil and then reseeded the area.

We need your help, Please continue to:

Bring your sand divot bag with you when playing and repair divots. Repair all Pitch Marks Comply with the buggy Blue Path rules Use the chipping Green for short chips off the mats provided. It should not be used for long pitching from one green to the other

🖉 Sustainable Development Award 🎑

Delgany Golf Club is delighted and proud to receive a Sustainable Development Award from Wicklow County Council. The aim of the awards is to showcase best practice in environmental protection and development.



Delgany Golf Club is playing its part in the wider sustainability agenda which in recent years has included rewilding large areas with native plants, large native wild flower areas, planting indigenous trees and encouragement of a local wild deer herd ,hundreds of squirrels, as well as over 100 species of birds and insects that are prolific on the course.

In Delgany Golf Club we have recognised the critical importance of the Sustainability agenda for the local community and our Environment. Thus as part of number of initiatives in this area we have a significant project running at the club in the following areas: (i) we have taken a serious look and made material changes in our use of fertilisers and other growth promoters to reduce the impact of trace elements within the soil (ii) we are irrigating the course using water retained locally in our reservoir. (iii) we have moved towards the green agenda with the modernisation of our machinery fleet with electric buggies and hybrid grass cutting machinery, which is not the norm on all golf courses, (iv) we are also moving to solar generation, to assist with our power needs within the coming year at both the clubhouse and machinery compound which will greatly reduce our reliance on fossil fuels.

Recently Delgany Golf Course has taken another material step in our sustainability initiatives, by introducing two honeybee hives to the Course. The Bees are native Irish Bees. The initiative, sponsored by the Club Captains and supported by EY, highlights the importance of honey bees in maintaining a healthy environment.

🖉 Sustainable Development Award 🖉

Delgany Golf Club have taken on a critical new sustainability initiative that will help protect native Irish honeybees. We have introduced two new colonies of bees into purpose-built beehives on the country Wicklow course to support these essential pollinators.

As they pollinate wild trees and flowers, they will in future play an essential role in ensuring a vibrant natural ecosystem.

However, the global bee population has been under sustained pressure over recent decades for a range of reasons, most notably due to Colony Collapse Disorder, a little understood phenomenon where worker bees abandon a colony as well as reduced habitats. This has resulted in a reduction in bee numbers globally and here in Ireland.

So, we believed we should play our part in protecting this beautiful landscape and with 125 junior members we felt they could and will see the benefits in the future.

we are most proud of our bee initiative and following our research we found that according to bee experts at the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) of the United Nations, a third of the world's food production depends on bees, meaning that our food supply is highly dependent on bees and their survival.

This important initiative will see 120,000 bees spread across two beehives this year, meaning that they can continue to pollinate the flowers and trees on the course and in surrounding local community. In Delgany Golf Club they are proud to make Biodiversity initiatives like this



to be at the heart of contributing to the broader sustainability agenda.

Betty O'Reilly and Tom Bergin, 2023 Club Captains, said: "Delgany Golf Club is now 115 years old, but this is first time we've embarked on a project like this, and we're really excited about this agenda for our local Community and our Club. The bees are currently looked after by two local resident Apiarists and they are offering training to anyone interested in learning more. 5 Interesting facts about honeybees:

1. To make just one pound of honey, bees have to visit approximately two million flowers and travel a distance equal to twice around the world

- 2. The average lifespan of a honeybee is only six weeks.
- 3. Honeybees live in colonies of up to 60,000 Bees.
- 4. Honeybees can fly at speeds of up to 15 miles per hour.

5. The wings of a honeybee flap about 200 times per second, which is what produces the buzzing sound that we associate with bees





2024 Updates on the Rules of Handicapping

On April 1 st we will see some changes to the handicapping system, the main changes are as follows

*THERE WILL BE A CHANGE IN THE WAY COURSE HANDICAPS ARE CALCULATED

The course handicap calculation will now take into account the difference between the course rating and the par of the course, so instead of playing to the course rating you will now be playing to par.

If the course Rating is higher than par, you will receive more shots, if the course rating is lower than par, you will receive less shots.

Our Charts will be updated shortly to reflect these changes.

***FOURBALL SCORES**

Individual scores from fourball formats will now be used for handicap purposes provided that

The team returns a net score of at least 6 points better than par,42 points

The individual players score counts at least 9 times

The players individual calculated score is greater than or equal to 36 points.

An individual players score is calculated using the following procedure

When the players score counts they receive those points

When the players score does not count, they receive 1.5 points, except when

Their partner only scores 1 point, they score 1

If their partner scores 0 points, they score 0

***THERE WILL BE A NEW METHOD OF SCALING UP NINE-HOLE /HOLE NOT PLAYED**

Improvements have been made to the method used to handle Holes Not Played, which will now be based on a player's expected score rather than a score of net par. When one or more holes have not been played, this method takes your Score Differential for the holes you did play and combines it with an expected Score Differential for the holes you did not play, based on the scoring pattern of players with the same Handicap Index as you.

This new method will produce an 18-hole Score Differential that more accurately reflects a player's ability.

*THERE WILL BE A CLAUSE ADDED TO RULE 3.2 PERMITTING COMPETITIONS OVER A NON STANDARD NUMBER OF HOLES TO BE USED FOR HANDICAP PURPOSES

*WHERE SOFTWARE IS BEING USED FOR COMPETITIONS, THE PLAYING HANDICAP WILL BE CAL-CULATED BASED ON THE FULL COURSE HANDICAP.

COMPLETING A FOURBALL SCORECARD:


Please note that only ONE score is to be written for each hole when filling in your scorecard. Multiple scores on a line can cause confusion and lead to errors (and possible Disqualification).
