First and foremost, at an EGM in the Clubhouse last evening, the new constitution was voted in to give effect to the main principles of the One Club Model as espoused by our governing body, Golf Ireland. There was a strong turnout, with excellent points and opinions made by several contributors. What is clear is that apart from the tasks involved in transitioning to the new framework, the Management Committee will take on board several topics aired on the evening and previously expressed in member submissions and questions, which will require consideration and consultation in the future. But for now, we believe the move to a One Club Model represents an important and progressive step in terms of ensuring the key principles of good governance, efficient and effective business operations, equality, and inclusion are enshrined in our Constitution and in what we do. A key One Club change is the appointment of a Chairperson to the Club and on behalf of the Management Committee and the members we offer our congratulations to Colm Whooley on his election. In stretching the 'Standing Orders' time limits to the maximum, Colm delivered his "Programme for Government", with a particular focus on getting involved in the day-to-day operational management issues and the financial implications of factors such as the adverse weather and our long-term debt obligations. We wish Colm every success and our best wishes in his new role.

Talking of funding challenges, the Revenue Committee under John Mullane's direction is doing great work in generating much needed revenue for the Club. The big-ticket item currently is the recently launched President's Draw, and we are delighted that this has got off to a tremendous start. However, our funding target is a marathon rather than a sprint, and so we need all members (family and friends also welcome!) to buy tickets at €20 each or 3 for €50. There are many ways you can invest, so don't delay! The fruits of the labours of John and his hardworking volunteers will hopefully be a repurposed Avenue that when finished will be a joy to behold and worthy of this great Club.

#### **Housekeeping**

Ladies as we approach what is a very busy golf season, just wanted to mention a few items of housekeeping.

Please avoid slow play - if you have lost a hole or more, you must ask the group behind do they want to play through.

Please repair all pitch marks on greens.

Fill the sand bags provided near the putting green and use the special sand mix to repair divot marks on the course.

On completion of your round, please make sure to add up S/F points of the card you are marking and record the score in the appropriate place on the card. It is not sufficient to allow the computer to total points or score.

Please also keep a record of your own score in the markers column and agree your score with your marker. Only sign cards when you are both happy that the correct score has been recorded.



#### **MATCHPLAY COMPETITIONS:**

Ordinary Members are eligible to play in the Matchplay Competitions mentioned above. Intermediate Members have a separate Intermediate Singles Matchplay Competition, and are not eligible to play in the main Singles Matchplay.

However, Intermediates are eligible to play in the other Matchplay Competitions but with certain conditions:

Fourball Matchplay – must partner with an Ordinary Member.

Foursomes Matchplay - must partner with an Ordinary Member.

Mixed Foursomes Matchplay - must partner with an Ordinary Member.

#### **RETURNING TO 18 HOLE COMPETITIONS:**

Friday, April 19th. sees a welcome return to 18 holes and we are hugely appreciative of the tremendous work by the Course Staff to get us here.

Naturally, we will have to protect the course as much as possible so the following rule - effective April 19th - will allow us to do that and make the competitions qualify for handicap adjustments.

Placing is allowed on Fairways ONLY.

In the Rough, a ball can be lifted, cleaned but must be REPLACED in the same spot as before. This does NOT mean teeing it up...

A ball plugged in the fairway can be lifted, cleaned, and then placed back down as near as possible to the same spot. A ball plugged in the rough may be lifted, cleaned, and DROPPED not nearer the hole.

N.B. The local Winter Rule we introduced to speed up play (when looking for plugged balls) is no longer in operation.

HANDICAPS FOR NEW MEMBERS: New Members who require a handicap must submit three 18-hole cards / six 9-hole cards (or a combination of 9 & 18, equivalent to three full rounds) from Delgany, from Saturday, April 20th onwards. They must be signed, dated, and attested by another Delgany member who has a handicap already. The card can be left in the Pro Shop or in the Office for the attention of the Handicap Committee. Each card must be clearly marked "For Handicap Purposes".

Howdidido.com do not provide official results, only unchecked scores players have entered.

### Super Seniors Series 2024

#### So, what is the Super Seniors Series?

There will be a Super Seniors event on either the  $3^{rd}$  or  $4^{th}$  Monday of every month from April to October (currently listed in diary as Open Seniors) with the first competition on Monday  $22^{nd}$  April, and finishing on the  $21^{st}$  of October 2024.

#### **Competition Rules:**

- Open Competition
- Entry is €6 for members, €15 for guests with members and €20 for visitors.
- Play from Green tees.
- 18 holes Singles Stableford.
- Eligibility for Super Seniors is age 70 and upwards on Monday 22<sup>nd</sup> April 2024.

Like the Champions Tour on TV, the overall series is a 54-hole event, with the best 3 rounds (from 7 opportunities to play) deciding the winner and Delgany Super Seniors Champion 2024.
