Wishing all our fellow members a great bank holiday weekend.



Course update

Lets talk about 'Pitch Marks'...... Yes, you know the things that you blame when your ball jumps as you miss a putt that looked destined to drop into the hole. We all have been there and yet we still suffer, so we decided to investigate the level of the problem. First thing on the morning of Thursday August 1st, our Greens Committee Chairperson Ian Cuddihy took a look at the 18th green before anyone had played it. In order to show the level of damage done by unrepaired pitch marks, Ian put a golf ball in each mark left on the green. There were 40 golf balls used (not all in photo for those counting!) to identify plug marks poorly repaired (25%) or not repaired at all (75%). Next up is our bunkers and again using the 18th as an example, you will see the lack of respect being shown to fellow members and our course staff. Dragging a rake across the sand where you played your shot is just not acceptable as you will see by all the footprint's left in the bunker, players need to rake all the areas that they have disturbed in the bunker and do so in an even manner by raking forwards and backwards not just dragging the sand out to the edges.

So next time you play, don't be part of the problem

PLEASE repair pitch marks, rake bunkers properly and lead by example.

CAPTAIN'S PRIZE - WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW:


Ordinary Members can qualify for the Final Day on ONE of the three qualifying days. To win the main Prize, you must have submitted three qualifying Singles cards in 2024, prior to playing. A player cannot win the overall Prize in his first year of membership, but can win one of the other prizes, provided the 3-card rule has been observed.

The timesheets for the qualifying days will be locked down on Thursday night, August 8th at 10pm, so players will not be allowed to switch to another qualifying day after that time.

If you qualify, your score is carried into the Final Day and combined with your second score.

In a slight change from previous years, we will have the Top 24 Qualifiers seeded this year and if you are fortunate to be in that elite group, you tee time will be predetermined based on your score.

General booking for the Final Day will not open until Monday, August 12th., at 8pm.

If you are not available to play on the final day, please write it on your scorecard.

In the event of any ties after scores are combined, the result will be determined using the Nett Score from the Final Day.

For those of you who don't qualify for the Final Day, there is a 9-hole 'Captains Plate' after the main competition.

For **Intermediate** Members, ONE score will be taken from ONE of the qualifying days and that will be used for the overall result.

As noted above, there is a separate Captain's Prize to the **5-Day Men** which is on Friday, August 16th.

GOLFER OF THE YEAR UPDATE:

At the time of writing, we have a four-way battle at the top of the leaderboard with a mix of youth and maturity all scoring 20 points and above so far. Jonny Nolan (9.2) leads on 25 points. Jonny had a good start to the year in the April Medal before a slight lull in scoring but is back again - picking up points in the last two competitions. Hot on Jonny's heels is veteran Christy O'Neill (12.8) with 23 points. Did he win his latest Singles Match Play to go level – we'll have to wait & see...

David Fogarty (12.2) has produced some great scores this season, amassing 21 points so far and is sitting in the wings, biding his time. Just 1 point behind David is Richard Spurgeon (15.4) on 20 points with a couple of really good results in the Medal competitions.

The month of August is a "biggie", with a lot of points up for grabs. Outside of the Matchplay and Bellevue Cup, we have a max of 25 points up for grabs. 10 for the winner of the Medal on Saturday 3rd and 15 for the winner of the Captain's Prize on 17th.

Will one of the top four accelerate away from the pack?

Could one of the pursuing pack on 10+ points score big and leap up the table?

Will someone else appear from off the radar to disrupt the leaders' run?


WEDNESDAY, 9-HOLE SINGLES:

Daphne Walsh Tynan



Daphne Walshe Tynan an appreciation.

Daphne was a member of Delgany Golf Club for 50 years, becoming Lady Captain in 1993. She was also Lady Captain of the Hole-in-one Society in 1996 where she played a variety of courses and made many friends.

Apart from playing golf, Daphne supported many teams and managed the Ladies Senior Foursomes. She played a lot of mixed foursomes, representing Delgany in the Cullen Cup with Leo Harmon and in the Dun Laoghaire Nina Ricci Matchplay with Colm Whooley, where they reached the final.



In the summer months she and her husband Tony helped to organise the Satur-

day 9-hole mixed competition in Blainroe, and until quite recently they spent the winter months in South Africa enjoying the sun, golf and their many friends. However, her loyalty was always to Delgany.

From her early days in golf Daphne was extremely sociable and made many friends wherever she played. She was a most generous person, fun loving, sociable but private about herself. She was determined and resilient in the face of trials and was the busiest, most active person one could imagine. Her diary was fuller in a week than most people's in a month, which she managed by being supremely organised, often fitting in her golf after hill walking and before pilates, then perhaps bridge to follow!

As a young housewife, and mother of two, Daphne ran a successful business in the skincare and beauty products industry before joining the United Drug company. Later, having lost her husband, Bill, and her beloved daughter, Melissa, she took on an exacting job at Dell Computer in Wicklow and did many courses to acquire a great knowledge in computers.

Daphne was also a very competent swimmer, and joined the Delgany winter swimmers for a few years, and was not known to use bad language until she jumped into the freezing 40 Foot in Dun Laoghaire for the first time! She would try her hand at anything, but loved reading, often historical novels, watching rugby, and had a great love of music, particularly jazz.

From her teenage years she was a great dancer, and she took to the floor often, as did many others, in her younger days in Delgany. In later years she became a proficient bridge player and was a regular player many times a week. She played locally in Wicklow with friends and online.

Delgany members and staff were very sad to learn Daphne contracted motor neurone disease and a huge wave of sympathy was extended towards her over the past months. She never indulged in self-pity and was so touched by everyone's good wishes. Until shortly before her death, she still managed to play bridge on-line, organised both by clubs and groups close to her friends in Delgany. It was ideal to keep her spirits up after she lost her speech and the effort these girls made, never to miss a session and support their beloved Daphne, was supreme.

I recently received a call from an old friend, Andrew Burke, who is the Dean of the Business School in Trinity College Dublin. I think the last time I saw Andrew was in 1980, so our reacquaintance was long overdue! He explained that earlier this month Bill Cockrum, an Adjunct Professor of Finance from UCLA, and a visiting Professor in Entrepreneurial Finance in Trinity, would be in Ireland with his partner Glenda. Bill is no ordinary Professor, a Harvard graduate, and over many decades he has been recognised as one of America's leading business academics, having been voted the #1 teacher of Entrepreneurship in the US by Business Week magazine in December 1996.

Although Bill's golfing days are winding down, he is a member of Bel Air Country Club in Los Angeles, and he loves his golf and golf course history and design. Staying for a few days in Powerscourt, he decided that he would like to know more about Delgany, especially our course designer Harry Vardon. He asked Andrew if he knew anyone connected with DGC and Andrew remembered me.

So, on Friday 5th July last, Andrew, Bill and Glenda joined us for coffee and over the next hour Patrick provided them with an abbreviated history of Delgany, from its origins, Harry Vardon's early design work, the early influencers in the Club including the Trinity College connections, RM Smyllie, the Bradshaw family professionals, the more recent course alterations and clubhouse modifications, up to the present day. On that Friday, the 'Two Mary's' Charity day was in full swing, and Bill and Glenda were delighted to see a full golf course and great activity around the place, with the wonderful weather playing its part.

Andrew confirmed to me afterwards that our visitors were enamoured with every aspect of the Club, and Bill was looking forward to reading through his copy of our Centenary book on his flight home. Of course, I didn't miss the opportunity to tell him that with two brothers living in Los Angeles, I might meet him for coffee in Bel Air CC someday, which of course he graciously offered! It would certainly be something to look forward to, as they are a lovely couple.

As a remarkable postscript, Andrew told us that his late father Frank was a journalist and he re-

calls him mentioning many years ago an article he wrote for the magazine 'Golf Illustrated' about Delgany, which he believed might be on display in the Clubhouse. And it is, with a prime position in our hallway, titled "County Wicklow at its best – the Delgany-Bradshaw Association Dates from the Club's Inception". Published in October 1951, no less!
